# **New Licenses Q3**

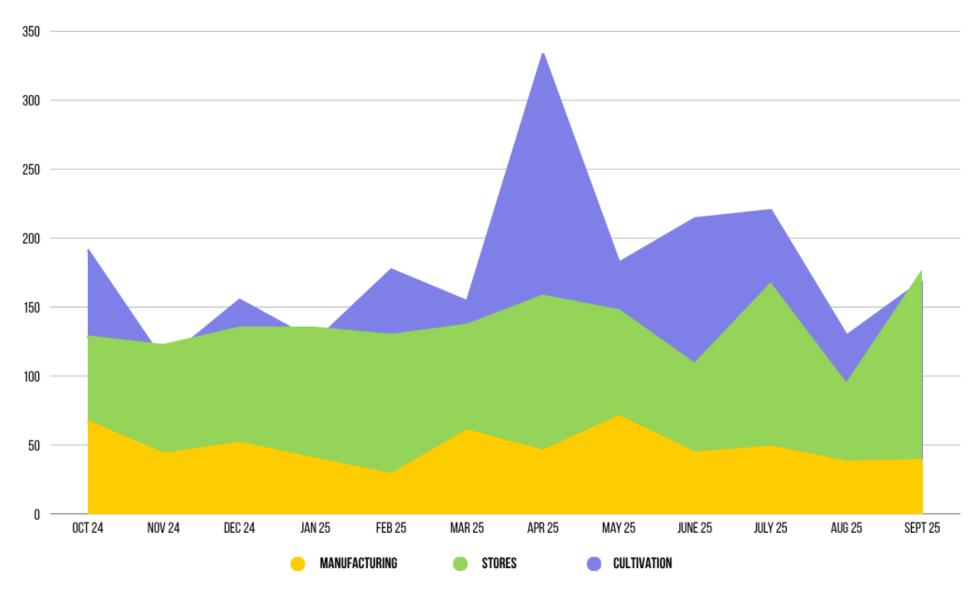
 Active cannabis licenses declined slightly to 38,364 from 39,047 in Q2 2025.

 1,256 new licenses were issued for all activities in Q3 2025, down (11%) from 1,417 in Q2 2025

28 states issued at least one license this quarter.

### NEW LICENSES ISSUED TRAILING 12 MONTHS



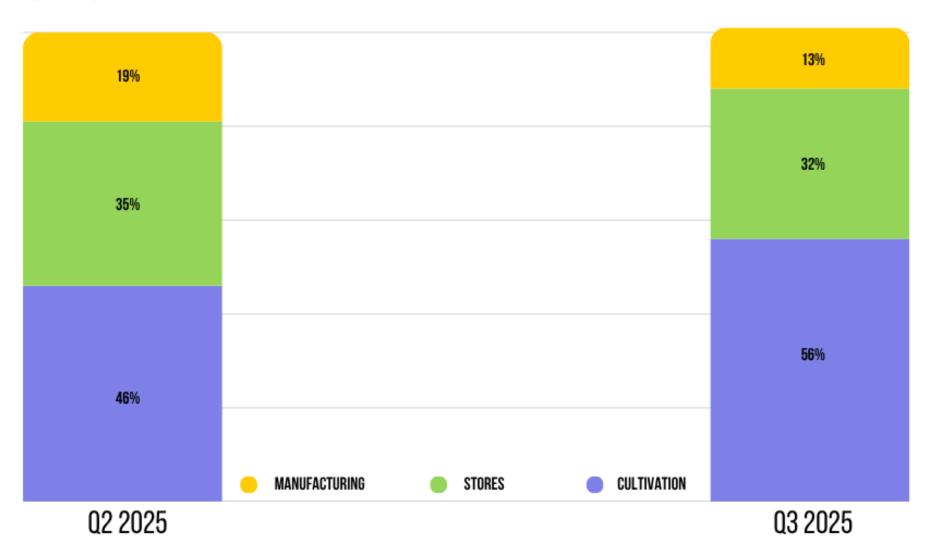


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# DISTRIBUTION OF CULTIVATION, STORE & MANUFACTURING LICENSES

 518 cultivation licenses issued in Q3; well down from 729 in Q2.

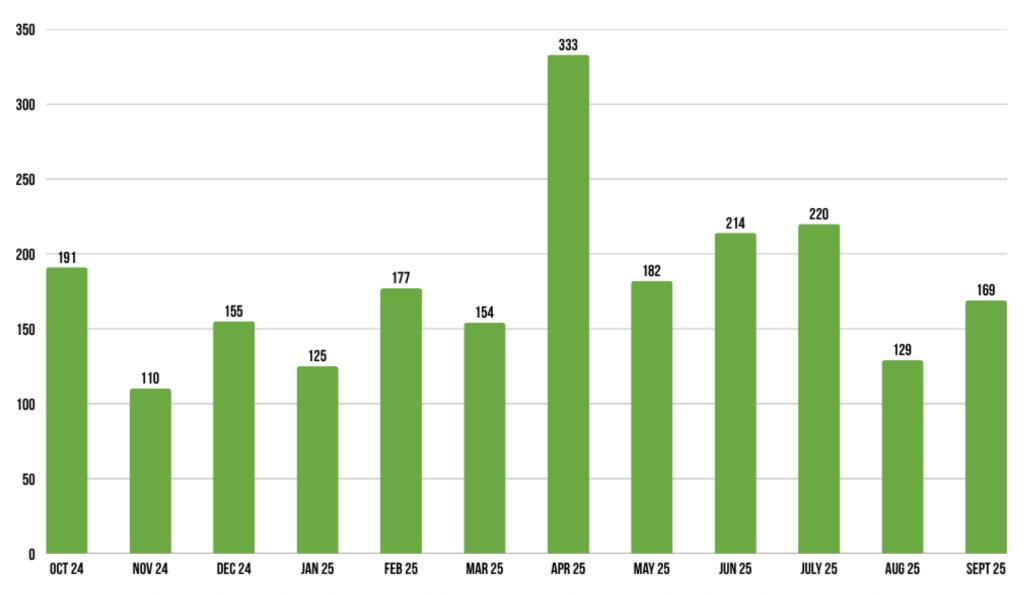
California issued 190 (37%), Michigan 146, Maine 51

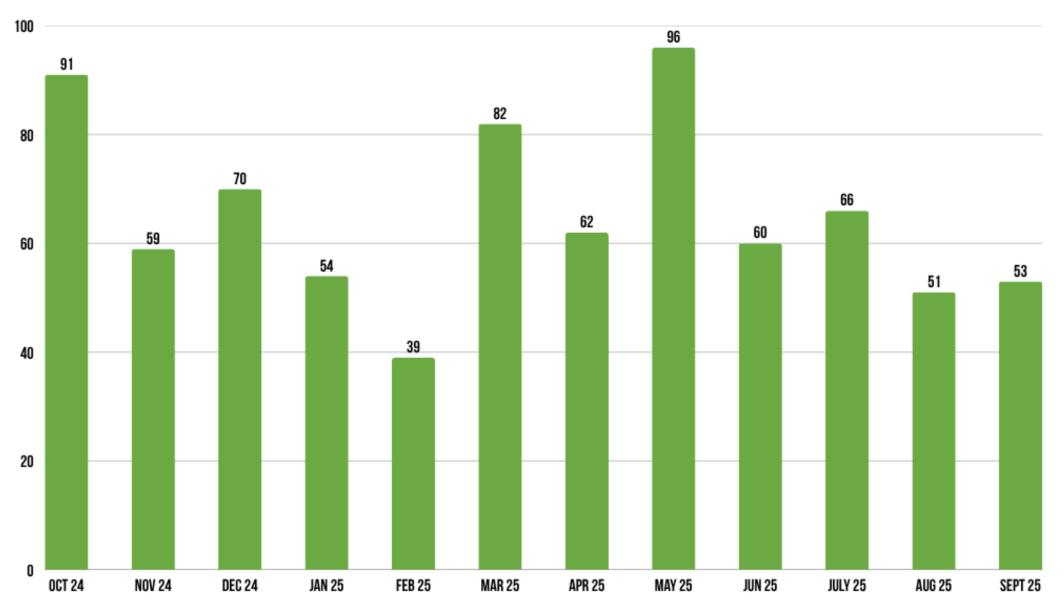

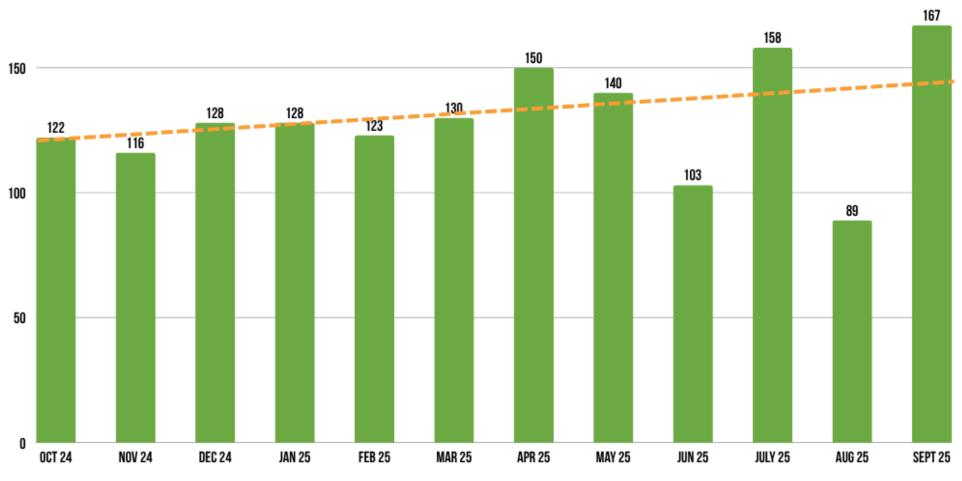
- 24 states added stores in Q3 down from 28 in Q2

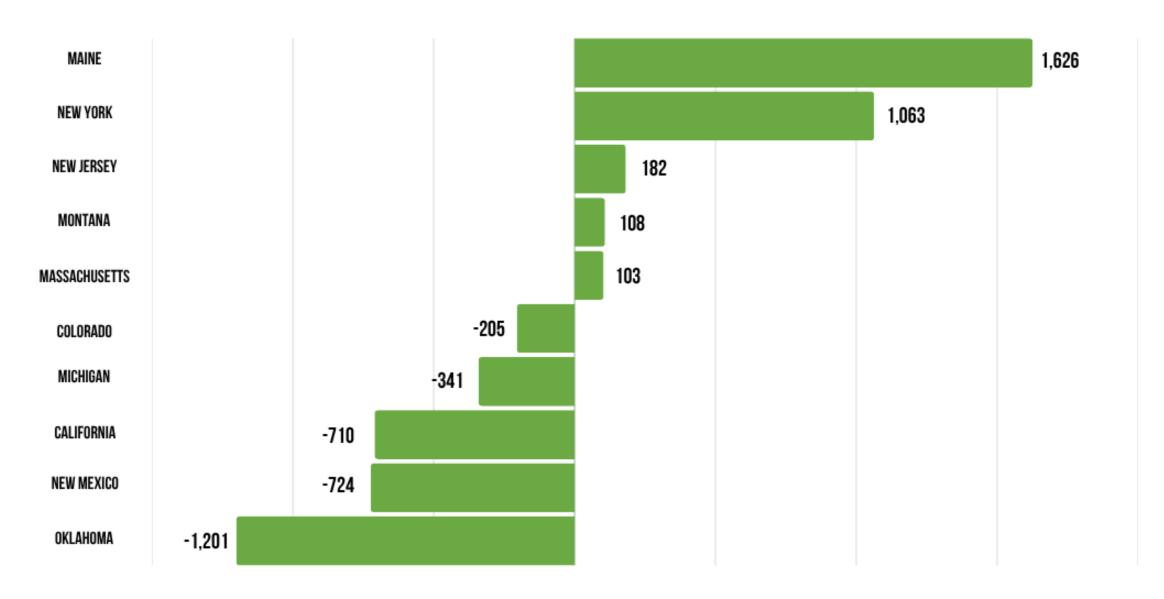

# 2024 Violations: Key Findings

2,484 violations were issued in the tracked states

Michigan issued 928 violations (37.3%) of the total

\$10,803,064 in fines were levied

Florida issued the largest fine at \$2.4 million

### Violations: State Leaderboard

 4 states accounted for 78% of all the violations issued

Large license states dominated

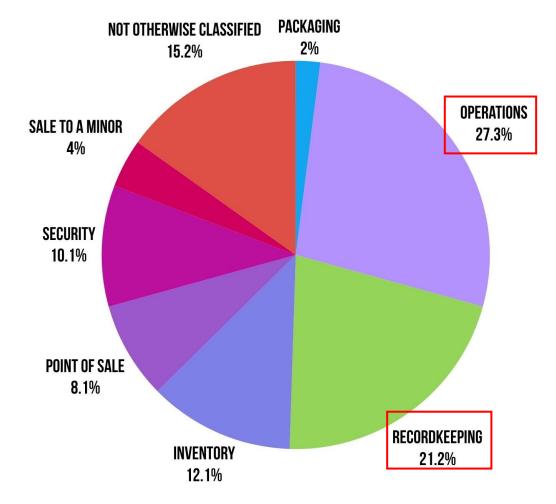

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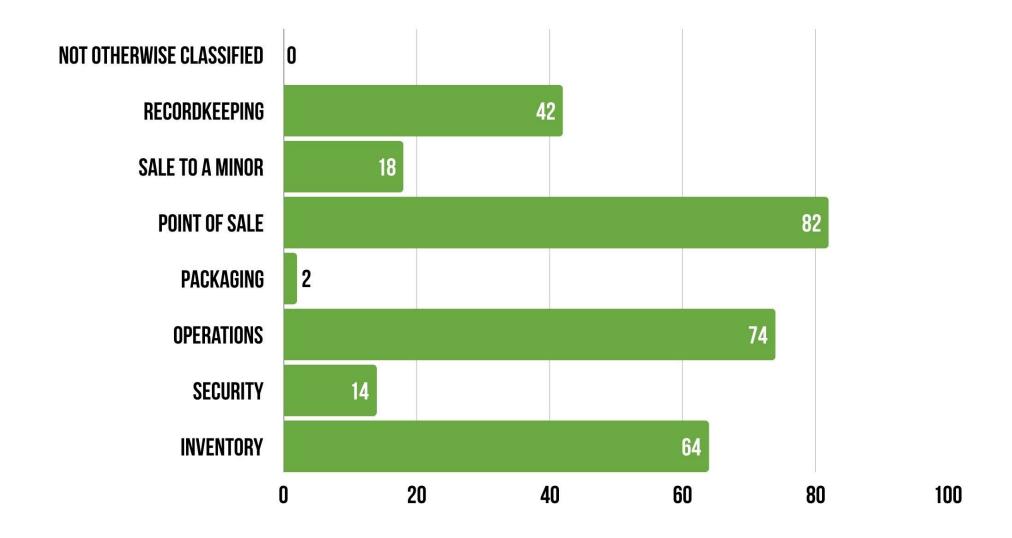


# **Categories by State**

- Sale to a Minor most prevalent in Oregon

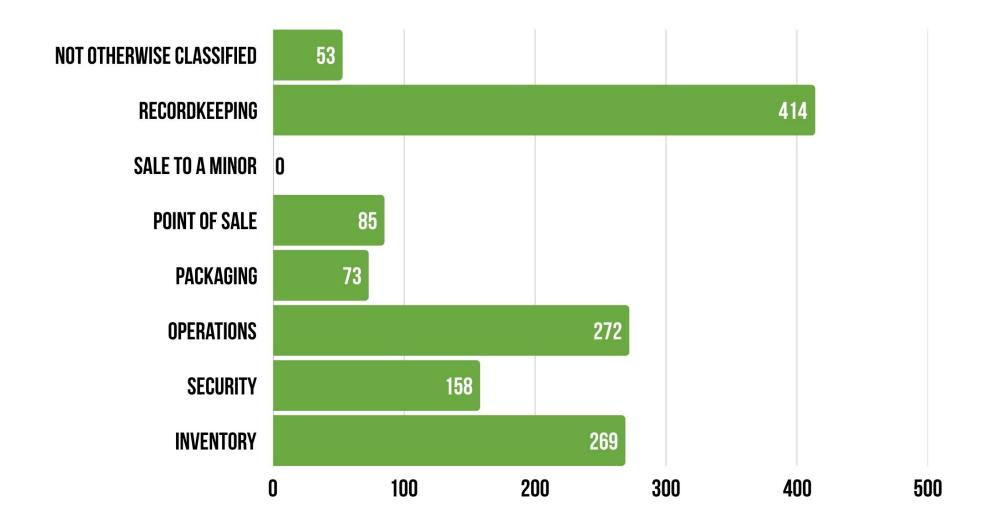

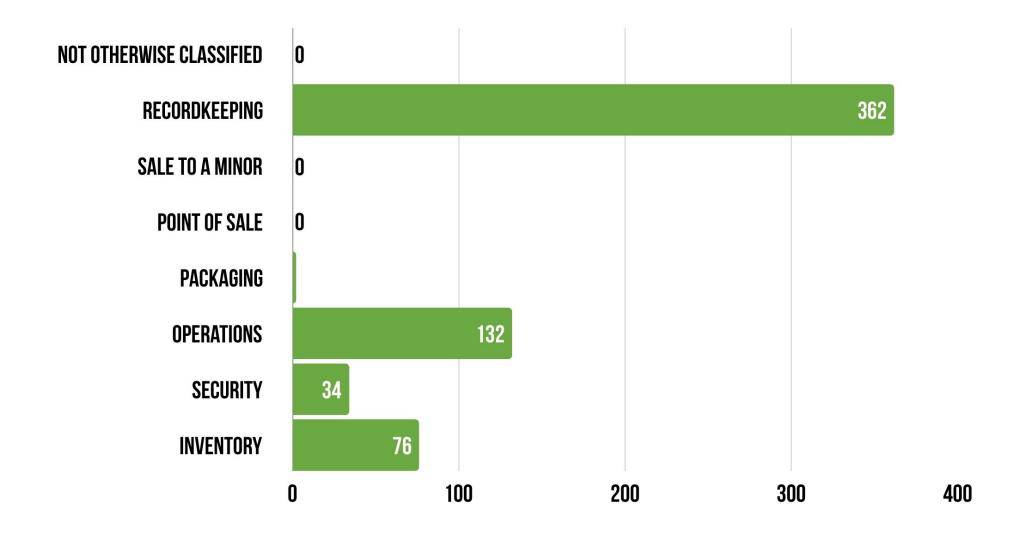


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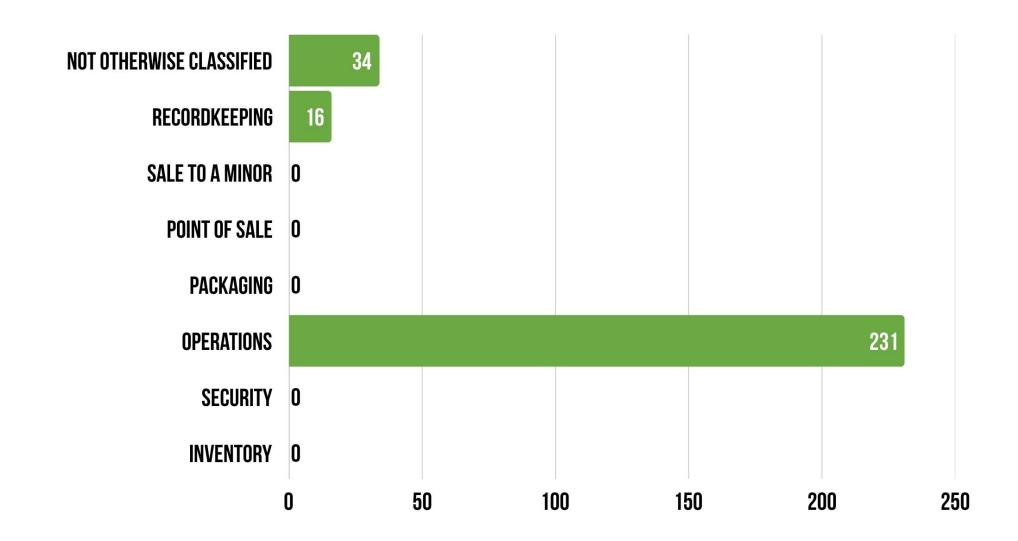

### **Factors to Consider:**

- Oversupply, price compression, and margin pressure
- Market saturation driving consolidation and M&A
- Product innovation: THC beverages, edibles, hemp-derived cannabinoids
- Illicit market competition undermining licensed sales
